I sit down to write this the day after the election results, and we have a new Prime Minister. It is interesting how things come together sometimes, also on my list of things to do today is to finish the preparations for tomorrow All Together Church Service and we are looking at the story of David – the shepherd King. David was the second King of Israel about 1000 years BC and probably its most notable and successful one. David grew up as a poor shepherd but with gifts and skills learnt and honed as a shepherd boy that made him a brilliant leader.

Tomorrow at the Service we will look at those skills, ones that nay leader would do well to hone, through some symbols of his life. The shepherd's crook used to lead sheep on the right path. The sheep pen creating a place of safety and shelter. The shepherd laying across the entrance way of the pen at night protects the sheep. He fends off attackers with his sling and stones. He feeds the sheep leading them to new pastures. He heals the sheep with ointment. David the writer of many of the psalms was a poet and musician soothing the sheep, singing to God and inspiring his people. David was strong, just and fair.

Sir Keir Starmer is our first openly declared atheist prime minister choosing to make a 'solemn affirmation' not take an oath of allegiance to the King. He is quoted as saying he 'does not believe in God but believes in the power of faith to bring people together.' when he would do well to look at the attributes of King David and the example of Jesus who is our great shepherd. Both model a leadership of love being a servant to those they lead, leading with humility and grace and most of all love. As Charlie Chaplin said – You only need power when you want to do something harmful, otherwise love is enough to get everything done.

God is love and those who live in love live in God and God lives in them. Let us pray that just as God is Love and just as Jesus came to serve not to be served so too the new leadership will champion love over all things and lead with humility and love. Let us pray too that as people of faith we will indeed live out our calling to love and bring people together.

We give a very warm welcome to Revd John Irwin—Curate.

I used to get nervous when asked to share my testimony because I didn't have a 'road to Damascus' conversion. I now realise that that applies to most people. Nor did I grow up in a church going family; for us, Sunday mornings were all about rugby as it was junior training and match day. But I always believed in God; I always had faith.

My early adventures in Christianity were not easy. Firstly, as I grew up in a time where the Book of Common Prayer was the norm, I always found myself on the wrong page, standing when I should be

sitting, and kneeling when I should be standing. It was a very confusing place. I tried a number of different churches, including the local Methodist Church but never felt as though it was where I belonged.

Then, as a young adult, I was always aware that as I was not confirmed, I was unable to participate fully in the service and this was very off-putting and as a very self-conscious young person, it was enough to mean that I didn't go back.

Suffice to say I did persevere and was confirmed and started to serve at the altar in the wonderful setting of Salisbury Cathedral. It was around this time that I started thinking that God was calling me but because he doesn't shout there is no sudden flash of lightning or dove descending, it took me a while to respond. About 25 years in fact. I did think that when I went off to Geneva to work at the World Council of Churches that this was in fact what I was being called to do, but although that was a fantastic experience, it soon dawned on me that I hadn't listened properly.

It certainly took a while to get here but those early experiences are still fresh in my mind, and I hope that I remain aware of them as I continue my ministry.

Changes in our churchyard.

We will soon be saying goodbye to a friend turned foe in the churchyard! A Cupressus tree a few metres away from the vestry has, over many years, grown into a massive specimen. The roots have now invaded the church drainage system and affected the stability of the vestry structure. We have taken professional advice but the conclusion is that the tree must be felled. The work will take place towards the end of July along with other minor trimming work to other trees in the churchyard. This will also have the benefit of opening the north aspect of the church revealing the building's true beauty when viewed from the car park. We will of course, plant another tree somewhere well away from the church in the autumn.
